THE PROGRAM INCLUDES:

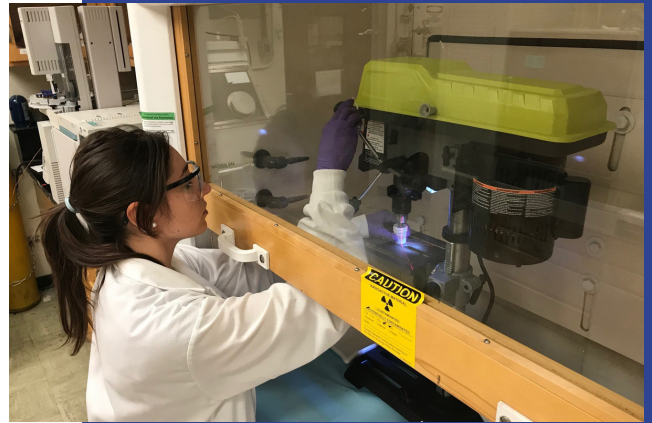
- HANDS ON work with Mentors
- PAID SUMMER INTERNSHIPS (10 weeks) at DOE Sites
- PAID 20 HOURS per week of research work at FIU's Applied Research Center
- TUITION WAIVER for Graduate Students
- Professional DEVELOPMENT and TRAINING

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:

- U.S. Citizen/ Permanent Resident Alien (A minimum of 4 years of Permanent Residency Required)
- Undergraduate or Graduate FIU students
- Minimum 3.0 GPA

APPLICATION PACKAGE MUST CONTAIN:

- A completed application
- Two letters of recommendation from FIU Faculty members
- Unofficial FIU transcripts
- Current resume
