

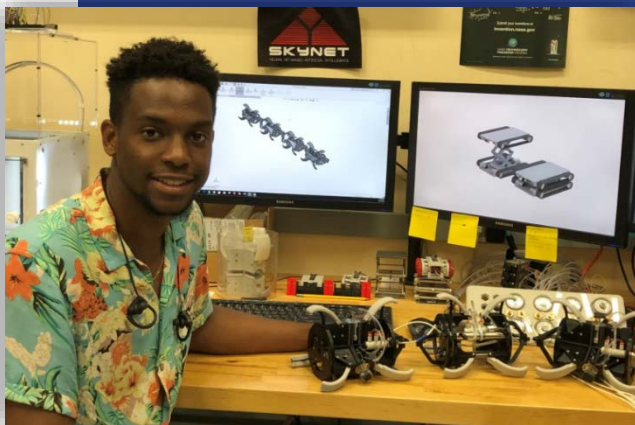
DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY - FIU SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The DOE-FIU Science and Technology Workforce Development Program is an innovative program between the U.S. Department of Energy's Office of Environmental Management (DOE-EM) and Florida International University's Applied Research Center designed to create a "pipeline" of minority scientists and engineers specifically trained and mentored to enter the Department of Energy workforce.



The Program Includes:

- PAID 20 hours per week HANDS ON Research with Applied Research Center's Scientists and Engineers
- PAID 10 week SUMMER INTERNSHIPS at Department of Energy facilities across the country
- TUITION WAIVER for Graduate Students
- Participation in conferences, Professional DEVELOPMENT and TRAINING



Program Requirements:

- U. S. Citizen/Permanent Resident Alien (A minimum of 4 years of Permanent Residency Required)
- Undergrads (Sophomores/early Juniors and Seniors accepted to FIU graduate school)
- Masters/PhD students (first or second semester)
- Minimum 3.0 GPA



Application Package must contain:

- A completed application
- Two letters of recommendation from FIU Faculty
- Unofficial FIU transcripts
- Current resume
